

The detailed course of each faculty is as shown follows:

**XI & XII Arts
Compulsory subjects**

- 1) English – 1 paper of 100 marks (3 Hours)
 - 2) Modern Indian Language: Hindi/Sindhi/Marathi, 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
- Optional Subjects (Any Four of the following)
- 1) Hindi/Political Science - 1 Paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
 - 2) History/Geography - 1 Paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
 - 3) Economics - 1 Paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
 - 4) Psychology - 1 Paper of 100 marks (3 hours)

Note: Hindi can be ordered either as Language or as subject and not as both (in Arts only)

**XI & XII Science
Compulsory Subjects**

- 1) English – 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
- 2) Modern Indian Language : Hindi/Sindhi/Marathi, 1 paper of 100 marks(3 hours)/ **I.T. only 60 seats on merit.**

Optional Subjects:

- 1) Chemistry-2 papers each 40 marks,2 hours each & Practical 20 marks
- 2) Physics- 2 papers each 40 marks, 2 hours each & Practical 20 marks
- 3) Maths & Stats/Geography- 2 papers each 50 marks,2¹/₂ hours each
- 4) Biology-2papers each 40 marks,2 hours each &Practicals 20 marks

OR

- 4) Electrical Maintaince-2papers each of 100 marks aand Scooter & Motorcycle Repairing.

(The arrangement for this subject has been made at Govt. Technical High School,Ulhasnagr-3. The students must seek admission thereby paying the fees).

For XI & XII Arts, Commerce & Science- Compulsory Subject.

Theory of 60 marks,2 ½ duration+project work 40 marks.

**XII & XII Commerce
Compulsory Subjects**

- 1) English- 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
- 2) Modern Indian Language: Hindi/Sindhi/Marathi, 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours) **I.T. only 60 seats on merit**

Optional Subjects:

- 1) Book Keeping & accountancy - 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
- 2) Organisation of Commerce - 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)
- 3) Secretarial Practice - 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)

OR

- Mathematics - 2 papers of 50 marks each (2¹/₂ hours)
- 4) Economics - 1 paper of 100 marks (3 hours)

The medium of instruction for Junior College will be in English for all subjects except Languages.

For Junior College Students: Students seeking admission in XI/XII and coming from out of Maharashtra are required to submit an Affidavit/Declaration on stamp paper duly signed by Executive/ Tahasildar/First class Magistrate/Notary that my admission in XI/ XII Arts, Science & Commerce is provisional at our own risk and will submit the migration certificate, passing certificate, school leaving certificate and marksheet along with attested Xerox copies within one month after admission failing which my admission will be treated as cancelled. These documents are to be sent to Divisional Secretary H.S.C. for confirmation of the eligibility. Forms are available in junior college office.

**Students coming from outside State of Maharashtra and other Board
(Other than Mumbai Board) for Admission**

Most Important

For Junior College Admission Std. XI & XII

Those students who have passed S.S.C./Std. XI from outside state of Maharashtra are required to fill up the application for obtaining Eligibility Certificate for admission to Std. XI/XII Junior College along with requisite documents and pay Eligibility fee Rs. 300 (as per board rules).

For N.R.I. Students the Eligibility Fee is Rs. 500.

The blank application forms for obtaining Eligibility Certificate is available in office on payment of Rs. 10.00 on the first floor office counter no. 7 the provisional admission will be given on the basis of undertaking of the guardian and student that Eligibility Form will be submitted within 7 days along with all the documents.

REFUND OF FEES

Junior College

The refund of fees in **junior college** will be done on a prorata basis as they are affiliated to Maharashtra State Higher Secondary Board, Pune. **No refund of fees will be made even on prorata basis, after 31st August.**

Circular No. SB/BR.High.Sec/Exam./Dated 7-3-2007

1. Candidate should be present for different exams. A candidate must secure minimum 35 marks out of 100 in each of two compulsory language, Environment Education and each of the four optional subjects.
2. Marks for theory, practical and oral in the subject where there are two parts, should be taken together and total marks should be considered for pass or distinction .
3. The result of the First Year Junior College (Std XI) class should not be decided on the marks obtained only in second term end examination. Equal weightage should be given to (a) First term end examination.(b)Second term examination (c)Year's Work-practical Unit test, tutorials, orals etc. and final result of each student for each subject should be decided on average marks $a+b+c/2$ only.
4. If a candidate appearing in all subjects and fails in one or more subjects, his deficiency of marks in maximum 3 subjects to a maximum of 30 marks but not exceeding 10 marks in any one subject shall be condoned for the purpose of passing the examination.
5. Although maximum 10 marks condonation is to be given in one subject such concession should not exceed the required minimum percentage of passing to the subject i.e. 35%
6. There shall not be any concession of ATKKT.
7. All the practical prescribed for course should as far as possible be completed by the student. However, they should be allowed to appear for practical exam and the marks for the journal should not be given if the student fails to perform practical prescribed for the course .
8. No candidate should be promoted to next higher standard if the fails even after applying the rule of giving the benefit of condonation of marks as provided in the rules of condonation No.4.
9. There shall not be a re-examination in the case of failure students.
10. In case of students who could not appear at the first or second term end examination for genuine reason ,due to ill health (on production of medical certificate in time) or such other reasons, beyond his/her control (such as natural calamities), the Head of the

Junior College shall hold the first term end exam as early as possible, but in any case before the end of the second term end. However, second term re-exam end examination . Such concession should not be given in case of student absent during the yearly work.

11. If a student fails to appear for 1st or 2nd term re-examination, his/her result of the first year junior college examination should be decided on the basis of $\frac{a+b+c}{3}$ formula only as prescribed in Rule No.3 i.e. on average marks $\frac{a+b+c}{3}$ and not $\frac{a+c}{2}$ or $\frac{b+c}{2}$
12. The procedure for conducting the examination mentioned under Rule No. 10 will be the same , as for the second term end examination. However, the question papers of this examination should be different from that set at the first / second term end examination. The question papers and the assessed answer books of all exams of all students should be preserved for one year for inspection be the education officer /Dy.Director.
13. The result of this re-examination should be declared within a week's time so as to enable the successful student to seek admission in the Second Year of the Junior College .
14. There shall be no extra fees for the re-examination of students.
15. Student failing at examination of the First Year of Junior College , i.e. Higher Secondary Std. XI are permitted to appear as regular student for F.Y.J.C. if they desire so.
16. Candidate who have failed at first year junior college examination shall have an option to claim exemption in the subject/s in which they have secured minimum passing marks at the previous exams 16 candidate who have failed at the first year of junior college examination shall have an option to claim exemption in the subjects in which they have secure minimum passing marks at previous exams Candidates who do not desire to claim exemption and wish to appear for whole examination the result of these student s shall be declared as per rule No.3.
17. The implementation of the first second term end examination of F.Y.J.C.class should be as per subjectwise scheme given in Appendix-A of Syllabi for std.XI & XII.
18. The circulars regarding the language subjects, Environment & project work have been sent separately. These circulars should be followed accordingly.

19.The annual work marks allotment for the subjects (except the sub mentioned in rule no. 18) is as follows:

20. Holding of an examination for private students of standard XI of junior college concerned is binding on the Principal / Headmaster.

21. The students who pass the F.Y.J.C.(Std.XI)examination be rewarded the following grades.

Grade I (With distinction: To successful candidates who obtain not less than 75% marks in the aggregate, calculated on the basis of the six(in case of vocational subjects) or seven subjects offered for examination.

Grade II To successful candidates who obtained not less than 45% marks but less than 60% of marks in the aggregate calculate on basis of six (in case of vocational subject) or seven subject s offered for examination.

Grade Pass To all other successful candidates.

Provided that the first (with disinction or First Grade shall not be awarded to a candidate who appears for examination with any exemption claimed by him /her
Provided further that if the aggregate total of marks obtained by candidate , is less than the total of marks required for obtaining the first grade,but not more than 3 marks
Only such candidates shall be given the necessary grace marks not exceeding there in computing his aggregate of marks for the purpose of awards of marks for the purpose of award of First Grade.
