Established in 1965, by the **Hyderabad (Sind) National Collegiate Board** (HSNC Board) which has set up more than 24 Institutes of Higher Learning. Today, it has transformed into one of the largest colleges of the University of Mumbai, with more than 12,000 students on roll in 38 departments from Six Faculties - Arts, Science, Commerce, Management, Information Technology and Mass Media, 23 undergraduate Departments, 11 Post graduate Departments, 07 Research Centres, 07 Professional courses, 07 Dual Degree Courses and 03 UGC-Sponsored Community Outreach Centres. According to **Vidyasagar Principal K M Kundnani**, who built the College brick by brick, *true education ought to focus, primarily, on the disciplining of both the mind and the body*. One of the main objectives in establishing this College was to provide viable educational opportunities for the children of the Sindhi Community, which had been displaced due to the Partition of India in 1947, and the backward communities of the city of Ulhasnagar and its neighboring districts.

Smt CHM College is situated right opposite Ulhasnagar railway station and located about 60 kms. from Mumbai in lush surroundings, in an area of 16 acres, with spacious classrooms, library, office, staff-common room, canteen, annex building and very well developed Sports Grounds.

The National Service Scheme has literally grown from strength to strength from 100 in 2001 to 300 in 2008. The College with strong units of N.S.S., N.C.C., Sports, has emerged as the focal point of Extension activities organised in the city in co-ordination with UGC Sponsored Women's Study Center, Gandhian Studies Center, National Youth Network, and YCMOU. The involvement of the students in various outreach programmes has ensured that they imbibe social values, and are sensitized towards social commitment. Further, their knowledge and skills are used not only for personal enrichment, but also for the service of society.

The medium of instruction for Junior College will be in English for all subjects except languages.

For Junior College Students: Students seeking admission in XI/XII and coming from out of Maharashtra are required to submit an Affidavit/ declaration on the stamp paper duly signed by Executive/Tahasilder/First class Magistrate/Notary that “my admission in XI/XII Arts, Science & Commerce is provisional at my own risk and will submit the migration certificate , passing certificate, school leaving certificate and mark sheet along with attested xerox copies within one month after the admission failing which my admission will be treated as cancelled”. These documents are to be sent to Divisional Secretary H.S.C. for confirmation of the eligibility. Forms are available in Jr. College Office.

Students coming from outside State of Maharashtra and other Board (Other than Mumbai Board) for Admission

Most Important

For Junior College Admission Std. XI & XII

Those students who have passed S.S.C./Std. XI not from state of Maharashtra are required to fill up the application for obtaining Eligibility Certificate for Admission to Std. XI/XII Junior College alongwith requisites documents and pay the Eligibility Fee Rs.300 (as per board rules). For N.R.I. Students the Eligibility Fee is Rs.500.

The blank application forms for obtaining Eligibility Certificate are available in office, on payment of Rs.10.00 on the 1st floor office counter no.7. The provisional admission will be given on the basis of undertaking from the guardian and student that Eligibility Form will be submitted within 7 days, along with all the documents.

Rules of Promotion

**Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education
Pune - 411 005.**

Circular No. SB/BR High.Sec/Exam./Dated 07-03-2007

1. Candidate should appear for all the examinations (Theory, Practical & Oral) and must secure 35 marks out of 100 in each of the subjects.
2. Marks for theory, practical and oral in the subject where there are two parts, will be taken together and the total marks will be considered for promotion or distinction.
3. In Environment Education subject the student has to secure minimum marks-21 marks in theory and 14 marks in project work seperately.
4. The result of the XI class will be decided on the marks obtained in First unit test, first semester, second unit test and second semester exam.
5. A candidate appearing all subjects and fails in one or more subjects, his deficiency of marks in maximum 3 subjects to a maximum of 30 marks but not exceeding 10 marks in any one subject shall be condoned for the purpose of passing the examination.
6. ATKT system is not applicable to the students of Junior College.
7. All the practicals prescribed for the course should as far as possible be completed by the student. However, they should be allowed to appear for the practical exam and the marks for the journal should not be given if the students fail to perform practical prescribed for the course.
8. No candidate should be promoted to the next higher standard if he/she fails even after applying the rule of giving benefit of condonation of marks as provided in the rules of condonation No. 4.

9. There will be Re-examination of I & II Semester on medical ground for the students of XI Junuior College shall hold the first-term end re-exam as early as possible, but in any case before the end of the second term end. However, second term re-exam will be conducted immediately after the second semester examination. Such concession should not be given in case of students absent during the yearly work.
10. If a student fails to appear for 1st or 2nd term re-examination, his / her result of the first year Junior college examination should be decided on the basis of $\frac{a+b+c}{3}$ formula only as prescribed in Rule No.3 i.e. on the average marks $\frac{a+b+c}{3}$ and not $\frac{a+c}{2}$ or $\frac{b+c}{2}$
11. The procedure for conducting the examination mentioned under Rule No. 10 will be the same, as for the second term end examination. However, the question papers of this examination should be different from the set at the first / second term end examination. The question papers and the assessed answer books of all exams of all students should be preserved for one year for inspection be the Education Officer / Dy. Director.
12. The result of this re-examination will be declared within a week's time so as to enable the sucessful student to seek admission in the second year of the Junior College.
13. There shall be no extra fees for the re-examination of students.
14. Students failing at the examination for the First Year of Junior College, i.e. Higher Secondary Std. XI are permitted to appear as regular students for F.Y.J.C., if they desire so.
15. Candidates who have failed at the first year of Junior College examination shall have an option to claim exemption in the subject/s in which they have secured minimum passing marks at the previous exam/s. Candidate who do not desire to claim exemption and wish to appear for the whole examination the results of these students shall be declared as per Rul No. 3.
16. The implementation of the first and second term end examination of F.Y.J.C. class should be as per the subject wise scheme given in Appendix - A of Syllabi for std. XI and XII.
17. The circulars regarding the language subjects, Environment and project work have been sent separately. These circulars should be followed accordingly.

18. The Annual work marks allotment for the subjects is as follows.

19. Holding of an examination for private students of Standard XI of the Junior College concerned is binding on the Principal / Headmaster.

20. The students who pass the F.Y.J.C. (Std. XI) examination be awarded the following Grades.
Grade I With distinction : To successful candidates who obtain not less than 75% marks in the aggregate, calculated on the basis of the seven (in case of vocational subject) or seven subjects offered for the examination.

Grade II To successful candidates who obtain not the less than 45% marks but less than 60% marks in the aggregate calculate on the basis of six (in case of vocational subject) or seven subjects offered for the examination.

Grade Pass to all other successful candidates. Provided that the first (with distinction or First/Second Grade shall not be awarded to a candidate who appears for the examination with any exemptions claimed by him / her. Provided further that if the aggregate total of marks obtained by a candidate, is less than the total marks of marks required for obtaining the first grade, but not more than 3 marks, only such candidate shall be given the necessary grace marks not exceeding there in computing his/her aggregate of marks for the purpose of awards of marks for the purpose of award of the first Grade.

21. Passing in the Enviromental Education, Every student must obtain a minimum of 21 marks out of 60 in the written Examination and 14 marks out of 40 in the project work seperately, failing which the student will be declared failed in the subject of Environmental Education and also will be decalred failed in Standard XI. It should be noted that no condonation marks will be granted in the Environmental Education for passing.

Those students who have secured 80% and above in the S.S.C. Examination can apply for the State Government Open Merit Scholarship (Fresh Award).

Students can get renewal of such Scholarship in S.Y.J.C., provided they secure minimum 50% of marks & fill up the Annual Progress Report Form within 7 days from the date of admission.

College Rules

1. Admission

- A) Application for admission to the college be made on the prescribed printed form. The form must be accompanied by:
- 1) Form for Identity Card with 2x2 size self recent photograph.
 - 2) Transfer Certificate and Mark-Sheet of the last examination passed, with two true copies if coming from a college affiliated to the Maharashtra Board.
 - 3) Transfer Certificate, Migration Certificate, Passing Certificate and Mark-Sheet of the last examination, with two true copies if coming from a college affiliated to any other Board/University.
 - 4) Students coming from any other Board/University should submit the Provisional Eligibility Certificate from the Maharashtra State Board.
- B) Students who are granted admission must pay fees on the same day, failing which they will have **NO CLAIM** to the seat.
- C) A student once admitted has to pay the fees for the whole year even if he/she subsequently leaves the college, or if his/her name is struck off the college roll.
- D) Leaving Certificate of the previous school or Transference Certificate of the previous college will be required from each student wishing to join the college. It can be called for through the college authorities, if it has not been submitted at the time of admission. **BUT THE SUBMISSION OF NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE FROM THE PREVIOUS COLLEGE IS ESSENTIAL AT THE TIME OF SEEKING ADMISSION.**
- E) In the cases of the students where the **Eligibility Certificate** is required, shall be admitted to the college only **provisionally** and at his/her own risk. Such students must submit the provisional eligibility certificate at the time of admission and confirmation of eligibility must be provided **on or before 30th October**. Otherwise their admission shall be treated as cancelled. (Refer page 24).
- F) The roll number to; each student will be given on admission. The roll number once allotted will not be changed during the year.
- G) On admission every student will receive an Identity Card. He/She must always **Wear** the Identity Card around his/her neck and must present the same for inspection on demand. No student will be allowed to enter the college premises / attend the classes or enter the Library / Laboratory / Gymkhana unless he/she has his/her Identity Card with him/her. The Identity Card is not valid unless a **Stamp** size photograph of the student is affixed on the space provided and bears the college seal and Principal's signature

and is signed by the student also on the reverse side in the space provided for.

H) Students should get receipt of every payment they make in the office. No complaint will be entertained if the corresponding receipt is not produced.

2. COLLEGE DEPOSIT

Application for refund of college deposits must be made on the prescribed form accompanied by the relevant deposit receipts within one year of applicant's ceasing to be a regular student of the college, failing which the college deposits will be forfeited. The period of one year will be counted from the last date of term, last attended by the applicant or in case of the student leaving the college with the permission of the principal during the course; from the date he/she is permitted to leave the college.

N.B.: A fees receipt and Identity Card must be produced while applying for refund of fees or college deposits. A penalty of Rs. 50/- will be levied for each receipt lost by the student and consequently not attached to the application for withdrawal of the deposits.

3. CHANGE OF COLLEGE

No student will be permitted to change the college during the course of the year without prior permission of the Principal in writing.

4. DISCIPLINE

Student/s violating these rules will be subject to the Disciplinary action by College.

A) (a) Students must maintain discipline both inside the class room and in the college premises and he/she must not do anything that will cause disturbance to any class or their fellow students.

(b) Loitering in the corridors or sitting on steps or corners of the college is strictly prohibited.

(c) Smoking and spitting is strictly prohibited.

(d) No society or association should be formed, no meeting be held, and no person invited to address the students in the college without the prior written permission of the Principal.

(e) In the college meeting the chair must be taken by a responsible person.

(f) The students are refrained from using the Mobile Phones in the college premises as per Maharashtra State Secondary & Higher Secondary Manual.

B) Library Rules

1. Library facilities are provided free of cost to the bonafide students only.

2. Books are issued for 7 days.

3. If student fails to return the book on or before the due date, a fine of Rs. 2/-per day per book shall be charged.
4. If student fails to return the book even after the completion of final examination, Marksheet of such student shall not be issued to him/her till he/she return the books along with fine or penalty.

5. ATTENDANCE

As per Maharashtra State Secondary & Higher Secondary Board Manual Student is required to attend minimum 75% of the total number of lectures and practicals for the academic year.

6. RAILWAY CONCESSION

- a) Bonafide students of the college below 25 years are eligible for railway concession for their season tickets between the stations nearest their home and Ulhasnagar. Applications on the prescribed form will be accepted between 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on working days in the office. As a proof of residence, student must show his/her ration card. (Railway Concession Form is enclosed on **Page No.32**)
 - b) Long journey railway concession will be granted in vacation only as per the rules published by the railways. Information about which will be given in the office between 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on working days.
7. In case of loss of Identity Card **OR** Fee Receipt, Rs. **100/-** shall be charged as duplication charges and student must acquire the same Immediately.

8. For **Change of Subject (Degree & Junior)** Rs. **50/-** Shall be charged. (**Form Enclosed on Page No. 34**)

Government of India Post Matric Scholarship to Backward Class Students O.B.C./S.B.C./N.T./V.J./D.T.

Those students who belong to **O.B.C./S.B.C./N.T./V.J./D.T. Caste** and whose Parents / Guardian having Annual Income upto **Rs. 65,290/-** or below are Eligible for Scholarship.

B.C. Freeship to S.C. & S.T. Students

Those students who belong to **S.C., S.T. Caste** and whose Parents / Guardian having Annual Income upto **Rs. 1,00,000/-** are Eligible for Freeship

B.C. Freeship to O.B.C./S.B.C./N.T./V.J./D.T. Students

Those students who belong to **O.B.C./S.B.C./N.T./V.J./D.T. Caste** and whose Parents / Guardian having Annual Income upto **Rs. 65,290/-** are Eligible for Freeship.

- e) Attested Xerox Copy of Ration Card
- f) Attested Xerox Copy of Domicile Certificate
- g) Non-Creamy Layer Certificate in case of students applying for O.B.C. Freeship
- h) Attested Xerox Copy of Fee Receipt

All the above students who have applied for Scholarship are required to open the S.B.Account in Canara Bank, Furniture Bazar Branch, Ulhasnagar - 3 and submit the same alongwith application form.

The students seeking admission on basis of caste certificates will be required to apply in prescribed application form for Scholarship / Freeship within seven days from the date of taking admission.

No application form will be accepted after completion of seven days and students will have to pay full fees.

The students whose attendance is less than 75% their Scholarship / Freeship will not be sanctioned. The students who secure 85% marks at the S.S.C. examination & 75% or more marks at the H.S.C. examination can apply for “State Govt. Open Merit Scholarship”. Students can get renewal of such Scholarship in S.Y.J.C., provided they secure minimum 50% of marks & fill up the Annual Progress Report form within 7 days from the date of admission.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

Students seeking admission on the basis of Caste Certificate will be required to produce ORIGINAL CASTE CERTIFICATE AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION and must attach certified xerox copy of the same along with the admission form. Without Original Caste Certificate, the admission shall not be granted on the basis of Caste.

Amenities

The College was very badly affected during the flooding of the college campus on 26-27 July 2005. It was under water up to 15 ft height for 48 hrs., causing severe damage to college property, - Library, Reading Room, Laboratories, Gymkhana, Media Room, Seminar and Conference Halls, Sports Grounds and NCC Obstacles Zone. However keeping in view the needs of the students, the College made spirited efforts and reconstructed its entire infrastructure and other facilities to meet the growing needs of the students.

1) **Laboratories**

The college has spacious and well-equipped laboratories in the subjects of Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Zoology and Microbiology, Computer science and I.T., DMLT, and analytical Chemistry Laboratory for the Junior and Degree college and PG Diploma courses. The Geography and Psychology departments have laboratories for the Undergraduate course. The laboratories are equipped with modern instruments to cater to the needs of the present syllabus and beyond. The Chemistry department has a spacious post-graduate laboratory, the Microbiology department has two research laboratories and the Physics department has one research laboratory. The college has well-equipped Computer Laboratories with peer-to-peer network and internet for the use of students to meet all necessary curriculum requirements and also beyond it. A Language Laboratory has been set up with a grant from the UGC. The Language Lab will provide special coaching in English, Marathi, Hindi and Sindhi language teaching and will seek to improve the spoken and written communication skills of our students.

2) **Gymkhana: Chairman Mr P C Mathew**

The college offers facilities in a number of sports activities. Among the outdoor games the college offers facilities in football, handball, volley-ball, cricket, kabaddi, kho-kho, basketball, hockey, ball-badminton etc. In the indoor games, table tennis, chess, carrom etc. are provided. The college has well equipped gymnasium that caters to the needs of the students for weight training, weight lifting, body building and power lifting. 3) **Library Committee: Chairperson Mrs J S Ozarkar, Vice-Principal**

The college had a well-stocked library and reading room with a collection of more than 60,000 books including **10,000** reference books, **35** journals and periodicals and 35 daily newspapers. The college lost its entire Library during the flooding of the college campus on 26-27 July 2005. Every year a large number of books & journals are added

to the collection. The library is open for the students between 7.00 a.m. and 8.00 p.m. on all working days.

Book Bank Facility: The College Library has a collection of more than 16,000 text books in book bank facilities provided to Degree College Students on First-cum-first-served-basis. Forms are issued to the students on which they have to write their demand for the books. A Maximum of 3 books of the subject are issued to needy and deserving students. These books are to be returned to the library immediately after the completion of their theory examinations.

Reading Room: 225 students can be accommodated in large and spacious reading room attached to the Main Library. The facility is provided from 7.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. (13 hours). Reference Books, Magazines, Daily Newspapers are provided to the students.

Open Book Test

The Indian Examination System has two important factors (1) Accumulation of information in memory and reproducing it in the limited time during the theory examination. The Open Book Test provides an ideal situation to the students to write in the examinations in an ideal situation where they can write the answers through memory as well as by referring to books and notes, if they wish. This examination enables the students to know the real status of understanding of the subject and memorising capacity and how much has been learned, and how much they need to refer to the books, and written notes for writing the answer. This also enables the student to evaluate the preciseness required in writing the answers which is essential, as the time is limited during the examinations. The Open Book Test is followed by a counselling session in which the performance of the students in the Open Book Test as well as the ideal answer is discussed, to make students aware of the preciseness with which answers should be written so that it is neither less nor more, because, more information takes away the time in examinations and less information reduces the marks awarded to the answer.

It also enables the students to assess the status of their subject knowledge. Open Book Test acts as a barometer of the level of the subject knowledge and their performance on the basis of marks obtained. Thus, students upgrade their efforts for acquiring more knowledge of the subject as well as sharpening the knowledge of the subject.

Preliminary Examination

The Preliminary Examination is conducted to provide an opportunity to write the examination and identify deficiencies before the annual examination. It is expected that prior to appearing for the preliminary examination, the students have prepared themselves fully for the final examinations. Therefore the preliminary examination provides a chance to the students to improve themselves after appearing in the examinations which they do not get after appearing for the final examination.
